Dear Friends

Red for Remembering.

Today is a surprisingly sunny day in early October. I am writing my letter early as Chris and I are about to go on holiday. When we get back it will be almost November with darker nights drawing in, then busy Advent and Christmas.



November also signals the end of the long Trinity season in the Church calendar.

Last year we introduced the liturgical colours into Richard Wakefield school as a way of explaining the story of Jesus - the colours match the theme words.

Purple in Advent and Lent, times of Preparing and Penitence.

Gold or **white** are celebration colours for Christmas and Easter.

Green is for the long Trinity season, when we grow in our faith, putting into practice the teaching learnt when we focussed on Jesus' life at Christmas and Easter, Ascension and Pentecost.

Red is mostly in November but also for Saints' days. We remember.

Sunday 3rd November 6.30pm in Rolleston Church is the annual "In Loving Memorial" service. We invite those for whom we have led a funeral service for their loved one in the past 2 years. Whether recently bereaved or years back, we are all invited to this service of hymns, a Bible reading and to light candles. We remember our loved ones together.

Sunday 10th November is Remembrance Sunday with the parades and services. We remember the sacrifices made by past and present forces personnel, fighting and serving for the freedom of people from tyranny and oppression, and maintaining peace in changing regimes. On Monday 11th November, Armistice Day, there will be short services in Rolleston and Anslow.

Red is also the colour of Pentecost when we celebrate and remember the Holy Spirit, the presence and power of God living in those who accept Jesus as Saviour. The Holy Spirit is the "essence" of Jesus, with us "to the end of the age" in whatever is going on in our lives, nation and the world. (Matt 28:20).

We remember when we worship together in Morning and Evening Prayer, and celebrate Holy Communion. Our services end with, "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord, in the name of Christ." We remember that Jesus is with us.

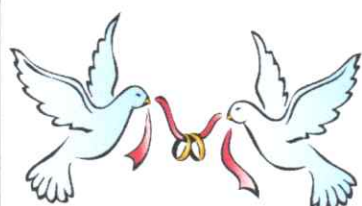

Tutbury WI

Our October speaker was Mike Taylor from Little Acorns. His talk entitled "from our woodland to yours" told us about Mikes woodland, how he makes a living, and the importance of ancient woodland today.

Mike told us of his journey from working in the steel industry for 30 years to owning an ancient woodland. Mike explained working with wood had been a hobby from being a boy, and with the help and support of his wife Julie and his children he went about buying 11 acres of ancient semi-rural woodland. He went on to tell us that there had been continuous tree cover there since Henry the VIII times and anecdotally Roman times before that.

Mike brought products from his woodland for us to purchase. These products were made using traditional skills and wood from his Coppice and sold within a 30-mile radius which makes it good for the environment, carbon emissions, and biodiversity.

Mike also talked about the decline of Coppicing and the challenges ancient woodland faces today. He asked us all to support this industry by buying local at Craft and Country fairs.

Our competition for an item made from wood was won by a piece of hand carved owls.

Our November meeting is on 14th November at 7.15pm and our speaker is Ian Pettit talking about Australia. Our competition will be an Australian artefact.

Benefice Recipe

The simple recipe this month is
Crumbly Shortbread Fingers

Recipe

220 unsalted butter, softened
30g icing sugar
80g caster sugar plus extra for sprinkling
30g cornflower
300g plain flour



You will need 1 Tray-bake Tin or cake tin

20.5 x 25.5 x 5cm deep, greased with butter

Method

Heat oven to 160C/gas Mk3. Put the soft butter into a mixing bowl and beat with wooden spoon or electric mixer until creamy

Sift icing sugar into the bowl and beat in (use slow speed at first with mixer. Beat in caster sugar./

/.... Scrape down the sides of the bowl, then beat thoroughly for a couple of minutes until light and fluffy.

Sift the cornflour into the bowl and beat and mix in with a wooden spoon to make a crumbly mixture.

Tip crumbs into the prepared tin and spread evenly. Gently press out the mixture being sure to press into the corners of the tin. Prick all over with a fork. Place in the oven and bake until golden brown

Remove tin from oven and set on heatproof surface. Cut into 24 fingers with a sharp knife then sprinkle with sugar. Store in airtight tin



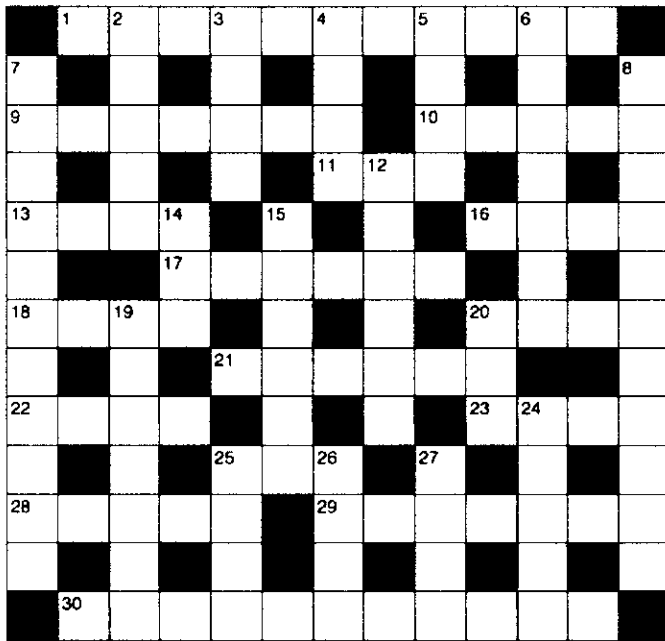

We sing A Capella in 3- or 4-part harmony. We don't hold auditions and members don't have to read music.

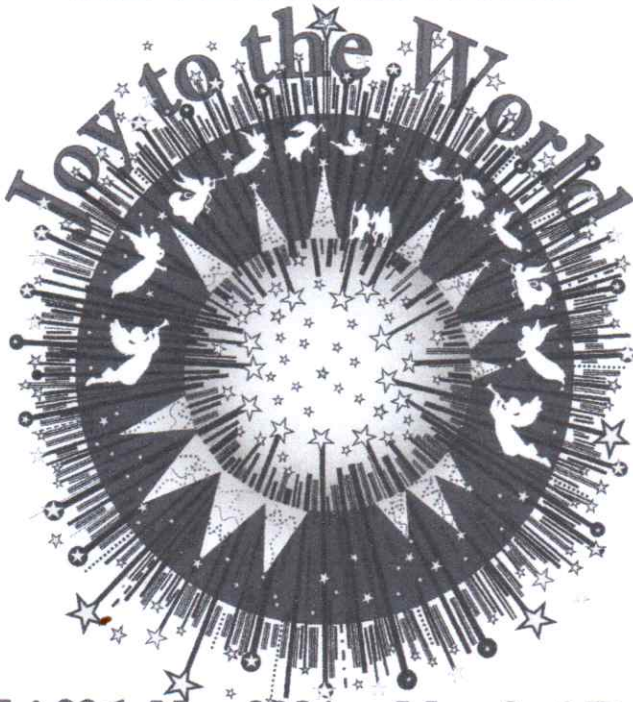
We are based in Tutbury, Staffordshire and sing on Wednesday evenings during term time.
